

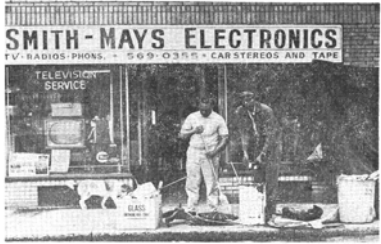

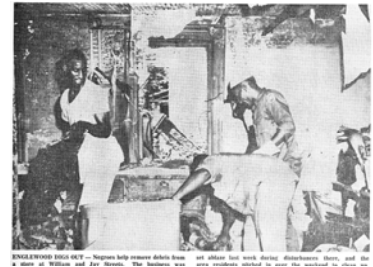

### Englewood Hit By Fire No. 15

ENGLEWOOD — A liquid fire bomb ignited the 15th fire in the predominantly black 4th Ward last night, leaving 40 people homeless. It also may have provided the first glimpse of the neighborhood's future.

The fire broke out through a second-story window in the rear of a three-story apartment house at 27 Englewood Ave. just before 1:30 p.m. yesterday.

A building tenant told police that seconds later he saw a man running down a fire escape directly below the fire-bombed apartment.

The fire caused damage to a two-story brick building at 27 Englewood Ave. and a three-story brick building at 29 Englewood Ave. The fire also caused damage to the rear of a three-story apartment house at 27 Englewood Ave. just before 1:30 p.m. yesterday.
